2023 AT A GLANCE

As LGBTQ+ people continued to grapple with the pandemic's aftermath, 2023 also brought an onslaught of increased anti-trans and anti-queer legislation and violence, heightening the community's need for the Center's affirming space and transformative resources. To meet growing community demand for our services, this year, we forged stronger local partnerships, expanded our incredible team, and significantly increased the number of in-person Center programs and events.

Annually, the Center sees over 100,000 visitors at our building and provides direct services to nearly 6,000 people, prioritizing programs for the most vulnerable among us and reaching community members from across the city. Currently our program participant's identify as 64% BIPOC, 9% youth, and 58% transgender or nonbinary. We also regularly recruit hundreds of volunteers and partner with dozens of local organizations.






FY 22-23
