2024 AT A GLANCE

For over two decades, the Center has been a beacon of hope, resilience, and transformation for LGBTQ+ people. Today, as anti-LGBTQ+ rhetoric and discrimination escalate nationwide, the challenges facing our community are growing—and the Center's services are more vital than ever. While we cannot predict exactly what the next four years will bring, our community, especially transgender individuals, immigrants, and youth, are already feeling the strain. Demand for the Center's services is surging as people turn to us for support in a time of uncertainty and fear.

Annually, the Center sees over 100,000 visitors at our building and provides direct services to nearly 7,000 people, prioritizing programs for the most vulnerable among us and reaching community members from across the city. Currently, our program participants identify as 64% BIPOC, 9% youth, and 58% transgender or nonbinary. We also regularly recruit hundreds of volunteers and partner with dozens of local organizations.

LGBTQ+ entrepreneurs joined our Small Business program to expand their knowledge and seize economic opportunities. Among them, 11 local artists participated in the launch of our Entrepreneur Training Program for Artists, gaining the skills to navigate the art world with confidence.

Community members accessed essential financial literacy resources such as safe, affordable banking and credit products, educational workshops, and 1-on-1 support from our financial counselors.

First-time homebuyers achieved their dream of purchasing a home in the Bay Area through our First-Time Homebuyer program.

People accessed our First-Time Homebuyer and Rental Program to gain housing resources, affordable housing opportunities, receive rental payment assistance, agency referrals, legal services, and 1-on-1 support from our housing counselors.

EMPLOYMENT SERVICES

LGBTQ+ job seekers received employment support through our weekly drop-in space, job readiness and mentorship workshops, and 1-on-1 assistance.

Community members secured living-wage employment amidst an increasingly challenging employment market.

Job seekers joined us for our bi-annual TLGBQ+ Career Fair, exceeding our attendance goals for both the Spring and Fall events! Notably, 48% of Fall attendees identified as trans or gender nonconforming (TGNC).

YOUTH SERVICES



Youth participated in our activities and gatherings! From celebratory events like Queer Prom and Halloween Movie Night to informative sessions on life skills, queer health education, and support groups. Center youth also accessed our drop in space for food, clothing, toiletries and other basic needs.

Referrals to shelters, transitional housing, rapid rehousing, and permanent supportive housing support provided by our youth navigation team as 1 of 4 city access points for youth who are navigating San Franciscos homeless response system.


